



He is the past president of IAS, surgeon to several sports legends including our beloved Sachin Tendulkar & a man with immense experience in the changing landscape of arthroscopic knee surgery. His keynote on the '**Changing landscape of arthroscopic surgery: the good, the bad & the ugly**' will be moderated by another set of legends Dr. Ashok Rajgopal, past president IAS who is credited with **pioneering knee surgery in Delhi** & Dr. Parag Sancheti, past secretary IAS **and pioneer in Knee Arthroscopy**. Arthur Schopenhauer, the noted German philosopher observed: "As a man gains experience in his field, he slowly climbs the mountain of expertise from whose top he can clearly see the multiple criss crossing roads, the shortest paths & dead ends". Dr. Anant Joshi, Dr. Ashok Rajgopal & Dr. Parag Sancheti are already on the sumit of the mountain of knee surgery thanks to a lifetime dedicated to the subject & will share their thoughts on how the rapidly changing landscape of knee surgery holds relevance for us today.

Operating on adolescents often involves drilling across the growth plate. There are natural concerns around growth arrest, coronal & sagittal plane deformities that may happen after a standard adult transphyseal reconstruction of ACL. Physeal sparing techniques though attractive are often non anatomic. In this landscape knowing how to bone age the child may be a challenge. Dr. Vaisakhi is a paediatric endocrinologist specialising in bone age & assessment of growth remaining among other things. She will moderate a session where Dr. Sachin Tapasvi & Dr. Alessandro Lelli will present their techniques of pediatric ACL reconstruction & she will share her pearls of wisdom on what constitutes the bare minimum work up of a child by a sports medicine surgeon to determine bone age.

Infections are thankfully rare in arthroscopic surgery, but when they happen, they often leave the sports medicine surgeon clueless regarding what to do, what tests to order, whether to start an antibiotic & so on. Often an inadequate work up from our end results in negative labs, completing the 'garbage in = garbage out' process. Dr. Neha Gupta is a physician specialising in infectious diseases & among other things, orthopaedic infections. She will moderate cases of infection following sports surgeries presented by Dr. Rajeev Raman & Dr. Sachin Tapasvi & she will share her pearls of wisdom on what constitutes the bare minimum work up of an infected ligament reconstruction case.
